

Revision Sheet – Term 1

A Summary of all topics and the areas that they will be tested on in the final exam.

Notes for Parents & Teachers

- **This sheet is complimentary to the revision lesson already done this Saturday by the teachers**
- The Children will be tested from the material in this sheet
- The exam will be in two blocks of 30 minutes approximately.
- They have already learnt all of this (week by week) and are not expected to memorise everything.
- The areas that they must memorise will be highlighted in blue as “to memorise”
- There will be two areas tested; their memorisation and their understanding.
- These two parts will be applied to the general Islamic studies and the hadeeth that they have memorised.
- Please note they will **not be tested on every single thing here** and there are things they have learnt that are not present on this sheet such as ayaat, hadeeth or explanation.
- It is good for you to read through with them, every night to help them revise this
- Sample questions are at the end.

Exam Layout

Islamic Studies

Written Test

- The child will complete a written test
- This will have a few questions chosen randomly from the following material.
- The younger classes will have multiple choice boxes, as opposed to writing questions, which will also be read out to them by the teacher if needed.

Oral test

- His/her answers marked by the teacher
- They will be asked to recall short things from their memories that they have learnt such as the names of Allah, etc

Hadith

Written test

- The child will be given some hadith from those that they have memorised
- They will be asked questions about the hadeeth, which they would need to answer.
- For the younger children this will be read out to them, and the answers will be multiple choice
- The elder ones will be expected to write answers in.

Reading Hadith

The child will be:

- Asked to read Hadeeth out in Arabic to the teacher from memory.
- They will read all the hadeeth that they have memorised up to now:
 - They will get higher marks for the **number** of hadith they have memorised
 - They will get a mark on the actual hadeeth they have memorised; their relaying of it correctly, without mistakes, etc
- The child will be asked if they know the meaning of **one or two** of the hadeeth in English.

Material

Coming to the Masjid

- A Muslim is calm, kind, gentle toward others.
- We go to the masjid to learn about Islam, lease Allah and go to jannah.

What takes place in the masjid:

- The 5 Daily Prayers Salah,
- Jumua,
- Janazah prayers,
- Qur'aan classes, lessons on tawheed, etc

Proper use of the toilet:

- Sitting and urinating: the dangers of getting urine on your clothes (hadith of the messenger about a person punished in the grave and the salah and dirtying the carpet)
- Making wudhu after using the toilet

The Prayer

- An Imam leads the prayer in the masjid.
- Everyone should stand ankle to ankle, shoulder to shoulder, no shuffling, concentration, no talking, etc.

We Have All Been Made By Allah

- Everything in this world has been made.
- There is a creator behind everything.

- That creator is Allah The Main Creator
- We are his creation.
- He is the one that made everything from its origin. When there was nothing in the world he made it: the Earth, the water, the trees the mountains.
- So why did Allah create us? The answer is to worship him
**“And I did not create the jinn and mankind except to worship Me.
 (Surah ad-Dhariyaat :56)”**
- Allah has names that he is known by

To memorise

The One True God – Allah - الله

The Creator – Al Khaliq - الخالق

So Allah is Al-Hayy’ – The ever living one - الحي

The Shahadah — Part 1

لَا إِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ

- **They must be able to say it**
- It means: None Has the Right to be Worshipped In Truth Except Allah
- So nothing at all, should be worshipped except Allah – the Creator.
- We do not worship the sun, moon, any human, mountains etc. because they have been created
- When something is worshipped besides Allah it is called **Shirk (memorise this word)**
- The one who does this is a **Mushrik (memorise this word)**

The Shahadah — Part 2

مُحَمَّدٌ الرَّسُولُ اللَّهُ

- **They must be able to say it**
- Allah chose to reveal the religion to a man
- It means that Muhammad is the (final) messenger of Allah
- There were other Prophets & Messengers before him such as Adam, Nuh, Ibraheem, Musa, ‘Eesa, Dawud
- He is the final Prophet

About the Prophet – **Memorise all bold areas**

- He was sent 1400 years ago

- He lived in **Makkah** in Saudi Arabia and was from a tribe called Quraysh
- This tribe worshipped statues and idols– they were mushrikeen
- His father was called **Abdullah** & his mother was called **Aminah**. His grandfather was called **Abdul Muttalib**, his uncle was called **Abu Talib**
- He was known as al Ameen – which means the honest and **truthful person**
- When he was **40 years old**, Allah revealed to him his message
- His wife at that time was **Khadeejah**.

The Quran

Memorise all bold Areas

- It is the book Of Allah – and there were books sent before:
 - Tawrah
 - Zabur
 - Injeel
- A miracle given to the Prophet
- It is the speech of Allah and **not created** just as Allah is not created – he is the Creator
- When the Qur'an is written down it is called a **Mushaf**
- It was brought down by Jibreel, to the heart of Muhammad.
- It was first revealed in the month of Ramadhan in the cave of Hira

How the Quran is used

- It is a cure
- Protection
- Learn About Allah & His Rules & Regulations
- Stories of past nations
- Recitation in Prayer

Incorrect Uses of the Qur' an

- Hanging on walls
- Amulets
- Prayers for dead people
- Debasing the Quran; the evils sorcerers do this

Surah Al-Fatiha

- Names given to this Surah.
 - The Opening Chapter (Fatihatul-Kitab)
 - The Mother of the Book (Ummul-Kitab)
 - The Mother of the Qur'an (Ummul-Qur'an)
 - The Cure (Ash-Shifa) – **MEMORISE ENGLISH ONLY**
 - The Incantation (Ar-Ruqyah) – **MEMORISE ENGLISH ONLY**
 - The Protection (Al-Waqiyah) – **MEMORISE ENGLISH ONLY**
- You can recite it over a sick person to make them better
- It can sure a scorpion bite

The Sunnah

MEMORISE THE BOLD PARTS

- The prophet was sent with two things **The Qur'an & The Sunnah**.
- The Sunnah is revelation from Allah
- The **Sunnah is the way** or "Methodology" of the Prophet Muhammad (may Allah's peace be upon him). So we:
 - Believe what he believes
 - We worship Allah how he worshipped
 - We act as he acted

There are four different types of Sunnah:

- What the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) **said**.
- What the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) **did**.
- What the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) **approved** or **allowed or did not allow**.
- The way the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) **looked** (such as his beard, etc) and his **manners**.

To bear witness that Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah means

- to **obey** him, in what he orders,
- to **believe** him in what he informs,
- to **stay away** from that which he forbids
- to **worship** Allah only in ways that he showed us

The companions of the Prophet

- The companions of the Prophet were called the Sahabah
- **They were the best of people**, after the Prophets and the most truthful of them.
- So some of them were his wives, some were his friends and some were his family.
- They understood what the messenger of Allah taught us, **better than anyone else**
- A few of their names:
 - **Abu Hurayrah**.
 - Aisha
 - Umar ibn al Khattab
- **Muslims do not speak bad about the Sahabah**. The Prophet Muhammad (may Allah's peace be upon him) said to us: "When my Companions are mentioned then withhold" [Saheeh, at-Tabaraneh].

The Hadeeth

A Hadith is a narration from the companion that is written down about the Prophet Muhammad; what he **said, did, commanded** or **forbid**, or **how he was**.

Our Religion is complete

Allah said in the Qur'an:

الْيَوْمَ أَكْمَلْتُ لَكُمْ دِينَكُمْ وَأَتَمَمْتُ عَلَيْكُمْ نِعْمَتِي وَرَضَيْتُ لَكُمُ الْإِسْلَامَ دِينًا

This day, I have perfected your religion for you, completed My Favour upon you, and have chosen for you Islâm as your religion. (al Ma'idah 5:3)

This just shows to us how wise Allah really is. In fact Allah is knows as:

الحكيم - The Perfectly Wise- Al-Hakeem - **MEMORISE**

العليم - The Knower of All- Al-'Aleem - **MEMORISE**

Bidah

- We take our religion from
 - **The Qur'an**
 - **The Sunnah**
 - **How the Sahabah understood it.**
- Some people however they differ. This is because they have made up new things in the religion.
- This in Arabic is called **Bidah**
- The Prophet (may Allah's peace be upon him) said "**be warned of the newly invented matters** for verily every newly invented matter is an innovation and every innovation is misguidance." [Sahih Sunan Abi Dawood no. 4607]
- Examples are:
 - Reading Quran for dead people
 - Wearing the Quran on your neck
 - **Celebrating the birthday of the Prophet**
- Bidah is not:
 - Using A phone
 - Driving a car
 - Using a washing machine

Islam & It's five pillars

The Hadeeth of Jibreel. **The children need to be familiar with this.**

Umar ibn Khattab (May Allah be pleased with him) said:

As we were sitting one day, with the Messenger of Allah صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم a man suddenly appeared. He wore pure white clothes and his hair was dark black - yet there were no signs of travel on him, and none of us knew him.

He came and sat down in front of the Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم placing his knees against his and his hands on his thighs. He said, "O Muhammad! Tell me about Islam."

The Messenger of Allah صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم replied, "Islam is to bear witness that there is no god but God and that Muhammad is the Messenger of God; and to perform the prayer; pay zakat; fast Ramadan; and to perform Hajj to the House if you are able.

The man said “You have spoken the truth” - and we were surprised that he asked and then confirmed the answer!

Then he asked, “Tell me about belief (iman).”

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم replied, “It is to believe in Allah; His Angels; His Books; His Messengers; the Last Day; and in Qadr (destiny) its good and bad.”

The man said, “You have spoken the truth. Now, tell me about Ihsan.”

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم replied, “It is to serve Allah as though you see Him; and if you don't see him, (know that) He surely sees you.”

“Now, tell me about the Last Hour (the Day of Ressurrection)” asked the man.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم replied “The one asked knows no more of it than the one asking.”

“Then tell me about its signs” said the man.

The Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم replied, “That slave women give birth to their mistresses; and that you see barefoot, unclothed, sheperds (Bedouins) competing in the construction of tall buildings.”

Then the visitor left, and I waited a long time. Then the Prophet صلى الله عليه وآله وسلم asked me, “Do you know, Umar, who the questioner was?”

I replied, Allah and His Messenger know best. He (may Allah's peace be upon him) said “It was Jibril. He came to you to teach you your religion.”

[Sahih Muslim]

Memorise only the names of the pillars and understand what they mean. The five pillars are:

- 1) *The Shahadah*
 - a. *To believe that none has the right to be worshipped except Allah alone.*
- 2) *The Salah*
 - a. *5 Times a day*
 - b. *Difference between a muslim and disbeliever*

Name of Prayer	When is it Prayed	How many units
Fajr	This prayed before the sun rises.	2 Units
Dhuhr	This is prayed in the afternoon after the Sun is at its highest point in the sky.	4 Units
'Asr	This is prayed when the sun is lower in the sky and has cooled. When a person's shadow is twice his length	4 Units
Maghrib	This is placed as soon as the sun has set	3 Units
'Isha	This is placed when the sun has completely set and it is dark everywhere.	4 Units

- 3) *Zakat*
 - a. *Give some form the money you earn in charity*
- 4) *Fasting*

- a. Stay away from food during the month of Ramadhan, from morning until evening
- 5) Hajj
- a. Travel to Makkah and do the actions in the way of the prophet (may Allah's peace be upon him)

The Pillars of Eemaan

Memorise the bold areas

The word for belief in Arabic is **Eemaan**

The pillars of 'Eeman are:

- **Believe in Allah**
 - Believing in Allah alone is called Tawheed. There are three parts:
 - **Tawheed ar-Rububiyah:** It is to believe that Allah is The Only Creator, Planner, Sustainer of all that exists.
 - **Tawheed al Uluhiyyah:** This part of Tawheed is that when someone knows that Allah is the Lord, The Creator that he worships him now alone
 - **Tawheed al Asma wa as-Sifaat:** To believe in the Names and Attributes of Allah, just as it is taught to us in the Qur'an and by the Prophet (may Allah's peace be upon him)
- **His Angels**
 - The angels are made of light
 - One of the angels is Jibreel
 - Angels are friends of the believers
- **His Books**
 - Some books were revealed previously, such as the tawrah and Zabur. The Qur'an is the final book of Allah.
- **His Messengers**
 - Nuh, Adam, 'Esa were all prophets and messengers
 - A prophet is someone who receives revelation from Allah. A Messenger gets a new law from Allah.
- **The Last Day**
 - This is the day when we are all judged
 - Our good and bad deeds are weighed up
 - Muslims go to Jannah
 - Non-Muslims go to Jahannam
- **Qadr (destiny) its good and bad.**
